I wish you all a friendly and safe stay in Croatia!



Camping/Caravanning/Motorcaravanning

What is vertical load (noseweight or drawbar load)?

The term “vertical load” means the maximum static load on the coupling point of the towing vehicle (i.e. car, van or mobile home) for a trailer (i.e. caravan).

As a rule this works out at between 50 and 100 kg for traditional vehicles, but can be more for heavier SUVs, off-road vehicles and vans.

But not every type of trailer has a vertical load that has to be taken into consideration before setting off – only trailers where the load is not fully borne by its own axles. These trailers include some with just one axle, trailers with two axles which are less than one meter apart and are positioned in the middle of the trailer or those that have no axles on the hitch folk.

Basically the most important points are:

- Vertical load indicates the weight of the towing vehicles on the coupling, i.e. the maximum weight that “bears down” on the drawbar of the trailer.
- For optimum stability when driving an outfit, ideally get as close to this value as possible, but do not exceed it. Also make sure that the maximum vertical load of the outfit reflects the value of the stated low vertical load of the vehicle and trailer.
- The vertical load is based on the towing vehicle i.e. loading up the towing vehicle reduces this weight.
- This does not change the permissible total mass of a caravan – payload/load capacity should not be increased by the value of the drawbar load.
- To determine the vertical load one can either use personal scales, a noseweight balance available in specialist camping outlets or a jockey wheel incorporating a load indicator.

France has drawn up the first barometer of outdoor tourist installations so as to have an idea of the number, trends and developments in the sector. Atout France, FNHPA (Fédération Nationale de l'Hôtellerie de Plein Air) and ADN Tourisme have taken on this task. Data was collected in 2022 thanks to the cooperation of 1,200 campsites who anonymously passed on information on their overnight stays thereby giving an overall view of trends in outdoor tourism in France.

This barometer is easy reading even for non-professionals. It was found that there were approx 16% more overnight stays at camping sites in 2022 than in 2021 (139.2 million) with an increase in the number of overseas guests, especially the British (+595%).

So 2022 was a record year and the uncertain economic climate, geopolitical situation and increasing prices doubtless played a part. Work is being done to improve the barometer because it has turned out to be an interesting statistical “tool” for the authorities as well.

Practical tips – for campers too

In my experience one always finds earth escaping out of the hole in the bottom of a **flower pot**. But I have read that this can be avoided if you cover the base with a large coffee filter which also makes emptying and re-potting that much easier. Worth a try!

Forgotten your toothbrush? Chewing gum with Xylit (sugar substitute) can be a solution because it encourages a build-up of saliva which strengthens the enamel and neutralises harmful acids.

MISCELLANEOUS

Traffic

Germany: 166,000 heavy goods vehicles travel along Germany's most used motorway section every day i.e. the A3 between Cologne East intersection (Kreuz Köln-Ost) and the Cologne Heumar triangle (Dreieck Köln-Heumar).

Munich is the most congested city in Germany, with 74 hours of congestion per year. It is followed by Berlin (71 hours) and Hamburg (56 hours). Not to be compared with London (156 hours), Chicago (155 hours) and Paris (138 hours)!

Health

Hiccups are very unpleasant – they usually result from eating too quickly but are sometimes caused by stress.

When the diaphragm contracts jerkily we end up with hiccups. One home remedy is gargling with cold water because this stimulates the vagus nerve at the back of the throat which calms the diaphragm.

Beware of carbon monoxide poisoning.

A common danger, especially in the winter months, because no matter what you heat with, the smallest defect in the stove will cause carbon monoxide (CO) to escape unnoticed. If inhaled, this invisible and odourless gas impedes the transport of oxygen in the body.

The symptoms are: Headache, dizziness, ringing in the ears and also nausea and if the CO concentration in the blood increases, the skin on the face turns red. Cardiac arrhythmias occur.

Leave the room (building) immediately and alert the emergency services. Place unconscious people in the recovery position and loosen tight clothing around the chest to make it easier to breathe. If breathing stops, start resuscitation immediately.

There are carbon monoxide meters that can be installed on the wall or ceiling that will sound an alarm if the concentration is elevated.



Curious facts/environment/culture

The switchback first appeared in Russia in the 17C and the first wavy roller coaster (30m high) was seen in Paris in 1817 – not very impressive compared with today's record-breaking big dippers in amusement parks.

The **Winter Olympics 2026** will be in Lombardy/North Italy, Milan (regional capital) being the biggest city in the area.

Denmark: UNESCO World Heritage site Stevns Klint, limestone cliffs on the east coast of Zealand, opened a new Visitors Centre last October. These cliffs are 66 million years old and rich in fossils.

The **tower that leans the most in the world** is not in Pisa (4.95° tilt) but in Gau-Weinheim (Germany). It is a mediaeval fortified tower with a 5.42° tilt.
