#### Camping/Caravanning/Motorcaravanning

**E-mobility caravans** have become very important in the **USA**. Following on from the the electrically-driven Bowlus and Airstream, there is now Lightship L1 and the Porsche Leichtbau-Airstream. Weight has however become an issue.

Nevertheless, new caravans that offer e-mobility should ensure that caravanning has a safe future in the USA and herald the start of a new era.

The San Francisco-based Lightship manufacturer plans to make this happen by introducing its fully electric L1 model. It has a chassis with e-powertrain and an on-board battery of up to 80kWh capacity. That should balance out the range loss of an e-vehicle as a towing vehicle. In order to minimise air resistance, the design of the L1 is very streamlined, but with a roof that can be raised when stationary at a campsite.

Airstream also uses the same aerodynamic trick in its new Leichtbau. It has resulted in a very light and compact model that can even fit into a garage. An elevating roof and hydraulic lowering make it streamlined when on the move yet roomy when parked. Its battery system also means that it can be network-independent on campsites. Coupled with up to three kilowatt solar power, the Lightship L1 can provide its occupants with an energy supply to last a week and, according to the manufacturer, "thereby put an end to campers' dependency on propane gas and other fossil fuels". **Netherlands:** 44.7% of campers watch television in their mobile homes, 59.4 % via a satellite dish and 25.5% via a mobile internet connection; 83.5% watch Dutch TV programmes.

In the first eleven months of 2022, 30% fewer caravans were sold in the Netherlands than in the same period the previous year. It would appear that delivery delays were the problem, caused by a dearth of chips.

**Belgium:** The introduction of a low emission zone throughout Wallonia on 1 January 2023, has now been postponed until 1 January 2025. This has been confirmed by the Walloon government.

The only exceptions will be oldtimers (30/40 years old?) and cars that do less than 3,000 km a year (though it's not clear how this can be checked).

#### Practical tips – for campers too

**Dead batteries** should not be left lying around endlessly because badly stored batteries can become dangerous. The sun's rays and humidity degrade the casing and toxic substances will leak out. If you keep different types of battery together such as AA and button cell batteries for example, they can overheat and cause a short-circuit. The same is true if there is contact with metal.

Lavender oil is useful to drive away **silver fish** because they absolutely hate the smell. They will go away if you put out small bowls of lavender oil in affected areas.

#### Traffic

**Switzerland:** The 2023 motorway sticker is yellow. An e-vignette is also in the pipeline for the middle of the year. It won't replace the sticker, but will complement it.

**Italy:** The city of Venice is planning to introduce an entry charge for tourists in the second half of 2023. It will cost between 3€ and 10€ (depending on one's date of arrival in the city). It can be prepaid by credit card, PayPal or bank transfer. The entry charge for Venice will be collected via a special app. Once the charge has been paid the app sends a QR-code to the tourist's smartphone. This QR code not only gives the tourist access into the city itself but also on to the islands in the lagoon and must be presented for inspection on request. Whether or not there will be some form of turnstile is not yet clear.

Exceptions will be made for inhabitants and people who work in Venice, children under 6 years old, disabled people and an accompanying person, people who are visiting prisoners or relatives, and competitors in sporting events. Tourists who have overnight accommodation (hotel, etc.) in Venice and who have paid the tourist tax are not required to pay this extra charge. Source: CCA-Journal(A)
