Work on the campsite is complete and the Taiwanese organisers are impatiently waiting for their guests to arrive.

As soon as you have booked your flight to Taiwan, send your flight plan to the organisers so that they can make arrangements for you to be met at the airport.

You can join a tour after the rally if you so wish at a cost of €700 per person. The cost includes accommodation, mineral water, entrance tickets, breakfast, lunch, evening meal and third party insurance.

The programme is varied and transports you to another world.

The rally programme is also diverse and includes excursions to the centre of traditional art and Lan Yang Museum (daytrip), to Jiufen and Jinguashi (daytrip), Ju Ming Museum and Yehliu Geopark

Matera will be a European Capital of Culture in 2019 and is famous for its cave dwellings, 13thC cathedral and Norman castle.

Transport in the town itself: Castelbus

Châteaubriant has four city gates and drawbridges. Huddled within the remains of its city walls, its elegant manor houses, half-timbered houses and tower make Châteaubriant one of the best preserved strongholds in the region.

The mediaeval castle and Renaissance palace are at the heart of the historic old town. The castle and manor houses take you on a journey through the town's historic and emotionally-charged past. From mediaeval times through to the Renaissance succeeding centuries have left the imprint of many notable personages including Françoise de Foix.

The area has 20 belltowers.

The Templar's Chapel, the mediaeval church of Saint Jean Baptiste de Béré, the churches of Saint Jouin and Saint Julien, are all tranquil examples of the area's religious architectural heritage.

The nearby 12C Cistercian Abbey, at Meilleraye de Bretagne, offers peace, stability and seclusion out in the country. The monks, who are very keen for you to share and experience the tranquility of this wonderful place, are happy to show you round and will arrange religious retreats.

Awnings : Updated standards

The DIN Standards Committee on camping tents, awnings and textiles has revised standard DIN/EN ISO 8936 on Awnings for leisure accommodation vehicles and specifies requirements, test methods and material performance characteristics for vehicle awnings in Europe. They will ultimately also be binding worldwide. Every use of a manufactured awning will be categorised and every stage of the production process subject to different requirements and tests.

These new requirements include resistance to weathering, tearing and other material performance characteristics. There is a table listing the minimum requirements of the most important features.

All of this gives the consumer more certainty when buying an awning that conforms to the DIN/EN/ISO standard. Clear rules have also been introduced relating to size to determine the exact dimensions, and for flammability and resistance to roof load.

Camping works out cheapest in Germany and most expensive in Switzerland. The table below gives the average cost for 2 adults and a 10-year-old child plus possible extra charges for a one-night stay at a campsite in the 2017 peak summer season.

TICKS and camping

Precautionary measures to take to avoid contracting tick-borne encephalitis TBE/FSME – Enjoy the natural world tick-free and stay safe outdoors especially when hiking

Wear light-coloured clothing with long sleeves

Use insect repellent

Tuck trouser legs into your socks and upper clothing into your waistband

Regularly check your body and clothing for ticks

Have tick tweezers or a tick removal card with you

Make sure you remove ticks correctly

Consider having a TBE/FSME vaccination

The risk of “getting” a tick is on the increase. The high season for ticks goes on to October.

The typical habitat for ticks that love the damp include sparsely wooded areas and the edge of woods and forests, long grass and bushes. If you discover that you have a tick, there are two ways of removing it. If you use a special tick card, place it as near as possible to the tick’s proboscis and the site of the bite and remove the tick carefully by gently pushing or prising it out. A better way is to use tweezers to grasp the proboscis and gently pull the tick out vertically by means of regular, controlled, **not jerking**, upward movements.

Once the tick has been removed, anyone who has not had the TBE/FSME vaccine should be vigilant over their state of health and if a rash or fever develops seek medical advice immediately.

MISCELLANEOUS

GERMANY: 500 years of white gold

Indispensable when it comes to preserves and seasoning, salt is still valued as an essential condiment and an important commodity.

Germany’s oldest working salt mine in the state of Berchtesgaden has been in operation for 500 years. The brine pipe from the salt mines to the old salt works at Bad Reichenhall has been in use for 200 years.

Because of this double anniversary, the Berchtesgaden salt mine is organising special guided tours underground, exhibitions of arts and crafts and Salt Festival events.

On Mondays and Wednesdays from May through October there are special guided tours along the Anniversary Mine Trail and daily visits underground that take you on a journey through time and the history of salt mining.

In **2016** there were 693,000 **traffic jams** on German motorways. Altogether they stretched for 1,378,000 kms.

Ireland: The Carrick-a-Rede suspension bridge is in Northern Ireland and links the small island of Carrick-a-Rede with the mainland. The bridge is suspended some thirty metres above the sea and offers stunning views. It was built in 2000 and was mainly used by fishermen in the salmon fishing season but now, on the whole, it is just for tourists. They generally prefer to take the boat back to the mainland because the bridge can only take eight people at any one time.

Luther 500 years

On 31 October 1517, Luther nailed up his 95 theses on the door of the castle church in Wittenberg. There will be lots of celebrations to mark this day in Germany and many exhibitions throughout Thuringia relating to Luther and his work as a single-minded reformer, translator of the Bible, pilgrim, excellent communicator, bookbinder, music lover and gourmet. He went to school in Eisenach, studied theology in Erfurt and translated the New Testament from Greek into German while in Wartburg castle.

Vignette and toll charges for European holiday destinations

Andorra: no tax or charge for driving on its roads or motorways

Belgium: cars, outfits and motorcaravans must pay to drive through the Liefkenshoek tunnel in Antwerp.

Cost for vehicles under height of 2.75m = €6, over 2.75m high = €19

Payment can be made in cash, with a credit card or via an On-Board-Unit

Bulgaria: Vignettes are required for cars, caravans, motorcaravans and trucks on motorways and a good many main (national) roads. An extra tax is payable on some bridges and ferries.

Cost of vignettes (depending on a vehicle's weight): 7 day: €8 to €45, 1 month: €15 to €89, 1 year: €50 to €891.

Vignettes can be bought at border crossings, petrol stations, post offices and other places that display a vignette symbol.
