### **Fukushima Declaration**

89th FICC International Rally 2019.9.28-10.6  
in Tenei Village, Fukushima Prefecture~

#### Preamble

To mark the 50th anniversary of the foundation of the Japan Autocamping Federation, the 89th FICC International Rally was held in Tenei Village, Fukushima, Japan from September 28 to October 6, 2019. The Great East Japan Earthquake that occurred on March 11, 2011 and the accompanying tsunami and accident at the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station brought unprecedented disasters to the area.

The rally was held under the slogan of "tourism / exchange / reconstruction" and was a great success

with the participation of about 800 campers from 14 countries around the world along with many local residents.

In order to reaffirm the significance of this rally and to guide future activities, as President of the Japan Autocamping Federation, I declare the following:



## Declaration

### I. Promotion of autocamping as tourism

Autocamping is a leisure activity that embodies the essence of tourism where people leave their daily lives and come into contact with people, nature and culture.

The fact that campers from around the world stayed at the auto campsite for 10 days during this rally led to the development of autocamp touring in Japan. Based on the results of this event, we will make further efforts to improve the environment for autocamp touring.

### II. International exchange through autocamping

FICC International Rally is a festival of peace where campers from all over the world gather together across national, language, and ethnic differences, getting in touch with nature and the culture of the venue, and deepening mutual friendship. As tensions among governments in Asian countries are growing at this time, it is highly significant that campers from Japan, Taiwan,

Korea and China participated in this rally and interacted closely. Based on the results of this event, we will make further efforts to promote international exchanges through autocamping.

### III. Autocamping contributing to regional development

As Fukushima Prefecture is recovering remarkably well from the nuclear accident, the biggest damage it suffers is to its reputation. Under these circumstances, people from all over the world who experienced the actual situation of Fukushima with their own eyes helped to dispel damage to its reputation. Based on the results of this event, we will make further efforts to promote the community through auto camps.

### IV. SDGs (Sustainable Development Goals) in autocamping

Autocamping is a sustainable leisure activity that pursues harmony between people, nature and vehicles, while striving for a rich leisure life, symbiosis with people, and environmental conservation. This rally contributed to regional promotion and world peace by making the best use of the natural, cultural and tourism resources of the venue. Based on the results of this event, we will strive to further pursue sustainability in autocamping.

### **Report on the 89<sup>th</sup> FICC International Rally**



To commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Japan Autocamping Federation, the 89th FICC International Rally was held in Tenei Village, Fukushima Prefecture from September 28th to October 6th. The slogan of the rally is “Tourism / Exchange / Reconstruction”. This expresses the desire to contribute to the further recovery of Fukushima through tourism and interaction by means of camping and caravanning. Approximately 800 campers and local residents from 14 countries around the world participated in the rally and socialised through various events and programs over 10 days.

On the first day, all participants gathered in the square in front of the beer hall, about 600 meters away from the opening ceremony venue, and marched to the venue, led by a local junior high school brass band. Mr. Kazuhiro Akase, President of JAC, Mr. Masao Uchibori, Governor of Fukushima Prefecture, and Mr. João Alves Pereira, President of FICC greeted everyone at the opening ceremony. Following that, children of village kindergarten dressed as angels entered with



the FICC flag. The FICC flag was raised on the pole set up at the venue to the strains of Beethoven's ninth symphony "Ode to Joy".

After the opening ceremony, the participants returned to the beer hall, where a welcome party was held. Everyone enjoyed Japanese food and beer and interacted with each other while watching the entertainment on stage.

From the next day, various events and programs were held every day. To give just a few examples: Tenei Commerce and Industry Festival, dancing night, fireworks, "toasted with sake all over the country", club parties, international nights, potluck party, starry sky observation, school visit, film festival, commemorative tree planting, lectures on the current state of Fukushima, daily bus trips etc.

Fukushima Prefecture was chosen as the venue for the FICC International Rally held in Japan for the first time in 25 years, triggered by the Great East Japan Earthquake in 2011. The huge earthquake and the accompanying tsunami and the accident at the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power plant shook the world. After that, "Fukushima" recovered strongly and overcame the radioactive contamination caused by the nuclear accident. Currently, the biggest damage suffered by Fukushima Prefecture, including Tenei Village, is the damage to its reputation. In some countries, the reputation of radioactive contamination throughout Fukushima Prefecture is still widespread, and many countries ban or restrict the import of food from Fukushima Prefecture. The most effective way to get rid of such reputational damage is to have people from all over the world to come to this place and see the reality. Therefore, with the cooperation of TEPCO and Fukushima Prefecture, we planned an inspection tour of the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station to demonstrate to people both inside and outside of the country that the nuclear power plant is well under control. At the film festival, "Happy Island" (English translation of "Fukushima") depicting farmers in the prefecture after the earthquake, was screened with English subtitles. In the lecture "Talking about Fukushima now", the farmers in Fukushima gave a detailed explanation with an English interpreter on how radiological contamination was overcome.

The FICC International Rally is a festival of peace where campers around the world gather across national, language and ethnic differences, touching on the culture and traditions of the venue, and deepening exchanges and friendship between campers and local residents. In Asia, diplomatic relations are extremely delicate between Japan, Korea, China and Taiwan. It was very significant that campers from Japan, Taiwan, South Korea and China gathered together to deepen their friendship through the rally.

Since its candidacy was approved at the FICC General Assembly held in Ponte de Lima, Portugal three years ago, the Japan Autocamping Federation has been working closely with the Rally Executive Committee. The FICC President and Secretariat, Fukushima Tenei-mura, and many volunteers were also willing to work together. As a result, we can proudly say that the Rally was a great success. On the last day, many participants said "It was a great rally!". However, I will only quote the words of Mr. Olli Russi, President of SF-Caravan, Finland:

"The Rally was definitely a success. You gave us a lot of new ideas and inspiration on how to arrange a Rally in a sophisticated way. It was very nice of you to present Japanese culture to us participants in such a pleasant and well thought out way. I trust that participants of Tenei Rally will spread the word of Fukushima prefecture recovery of the 2011 tragedy and how the area offers



wonderful possibilities for relaxation and joy about the beautiful nature. Not to mention the high quality water, rice and sake. We had wonderful days in Tenei and enjoyed your hospitality wholeheartedly.”

## 20th F.I.C.C. ASIA-PACIFIC RALLY from 30.04 to 04.05 2020 IN FULONG/TAIWAN

Following the rally proper, the organiser is proposing a Post-Rally Tour to give participants a chance to see more of Taiwan's main attractions.

### *Post-Rally Tour*

#### **5/4 (Mon)**

- Chung Tai Chan Monastery

Viewed from afar, the main building of Chung Tai resembles a cultivator in sitting meditation, surrounded by mountains, majestic and serene. The three central Buddha halls rise vertically to the golden dome on top, symbolizing sudden enlightenment to the ultimate truth—"awaken the mind and see the true nature; seeing the true nature one becomes a buddha." The pilgrimage stairways on both sides of the monastery represent the gradual bodhisattva path (a bodhisattva is a Buddha-to-be, one with infinite compassion for all beings), each step leading to the attainment of buddhahood not just for oneself but for all beings.

The architecture of Chung Tai Chan Monastery expresses a harmony of the arts, culture, science, and the teachings of the Buddha, and is a wonderful application of the Five Modern Approaches of Buddhism. Soon after the Monastery's completion, it was awarded "The Taiwan Architecture Award" in 2002, and "The International Award for Lighting Design" in 2003. Having received wide acclaim and recognition, the monastery is a landmark of 21st century religious architecture.

- Sun Moon Lake National Scenic Area

Sun Moon Lake is the largest lake in Taiwan and one of the most beautiful and most famous tour sites in Asia. Shaped like an irregular rhombus, the eastern part of the Sun Moon Lake is shaped like a round sun while the western part is like a crescent moon. Thus it was named "Sun Moon Lake." The beauty of the Sun Moon Lake lies in its calm, turquoise waters complemented by the majestic mountains that surround the lake. Layers upon layers of mountains and countless mountain peaks can be seen as more distant mountains fade into the sky. Like a mystical Chinese painting, the scenery of the Sun Moon Lake is truly breathtaking.



## 5/5(Tue)

- Alishan National Forest Recreation Area

Alishan National Forest Recreation Area, with its forest railways, sacred trees, sea of clouds, sunrise, and cherry blossoms, is the most famous and popular forest recreational area in Taiwan.

The Alishan Mountain Range is one of the Top Five Mountain Ranges in Taiwan. Rich in Taiwan Red Cypress and Taiwan Yellow Cypress ever since ancient times, Alishan became the largest forest area in 1912 until the end of 1960s. The primitive cypress forests almost died out after logging by the Japanese and the nationalist government. Only some 40 Giant Red Cypress beside the Giant-tree Plant Walk-1 and -2 have survived to date for us to remember the majestic forest of Sacred Trees back in the day. "Alishan Sianglin Sacred Tree", with a height of 45 meters and a circumference of 12.3 meters, is approximately 2,300 years old and the tallest tree of all. This is a stop that visitors to Alishan should not miss.



- Sister Lakes

The lakes are two high mountain lakes, one large and one small.

It is said that two aboriginal girls could not find love and committed suicide here. The little sister lake is oval in shape, the elder sister lake is larger and rectangular and has two wooden "love pavilions" built on Formosan red cypress bases. The two lakes are less than 50 meters apart.





## 5/6(Wed)

- Chihkan Tower


Chihkan Tower is the oldest building in Tainan's West Central District, and along with Anping District's Anping Fort, the two buildings are Tainan's most famous landmarks. Originally built as Fort Provintia in 1652 by the Dutch, the building set the tone as the location of the administrative center of Tainan, and has gone through numerous repairs and refurbishments over the past 300 years to give it its current appearance.



- Pier-2 Art Center

At Pier-2, Collision is a Driving Force.

It was once an abandoned and forgotten warehouse buried in history due to the move from an industrial based segment to the service sector. However, with a group of persistent artists who injected waves of creativity and inspiration into the area, Pier-2 area was released and re-born making the region a place where tourists and locals can come together to enjoy fine art. With the collision of an old area and modern fine art, Pier-2 has become an area of new vitality and liveliness.



- Xizi Bay


Xizi Bay is perched on the sea at the western edge of Kaohsiung City, just southwest of Mt. Longevity. Its main feature is a beach known for its clear blue water, the beauty of its sunsets, and its natural reef. The atmosphere and the scenery here change from morning to night; each time of the day has its special attraction, but the brilliant colors of the sunset are unparalleled in their beauty.



- Former British Consulate

The British Consular Residence at Takow was designed in the Baroque style of late Renaissance architecture, originally designed by a British architect.

The interior is currently displaying precious Kaohsiung historical materials, pictures, objects and models, so the consulate is also known as the Kaohsiung Museum of History.



## 5/7(Thu)

- Maobitou

Maobitou is the southernmost tip of Taiwan 3.5 km away from White Sand Bay (Baisha Beach) on the southeast corner of the Hengchun Peninsula.

The name "Maobitou" which means "cat's nose and head" in Mandarin comes from its unique appearance like a crouching cat.

Maobitou is an excellent place to appreciate magnificent ocean views and watch coral seashore being crashed by the waves. The coast of coral reefs features spectacular landforms that are affected by wave erosion, efflorescence, and salt-soaking. The natural landscapes such as wave erosion caves, ditches, and pillars are amazing rock features that one should not miss out while visiting Kenting.



- Eluanbi Lighthouse

Eluanbi Park was created in 1982 to provide an appropriate venue for people coming to visit Taiwan's southernmost point and one of the peninsula's most notable landmarks, the Eluanbi Lighthouse, also called "The Light of East Asia." It stands 21.4 meters high and is reputedly the




brightest lighthouse in Asia. The park covers an area of 59 hectares. Within the park there are a number of recreational facilities and a wide range of interesting geological, botanical, and ornithological features. The area covered by the park is also the site of one of Kending's prehistoric cultures.



- Beinan Cultural Park

This is the site of the largest and most complete prehistoric settlement that has been discovered in Taiwan so far; in its heyday, the settlement may have covered an area of more than 300,000 square meters. It was found during construction work at the back of Taitung's New Railway Station on the South-Link Railway in 1980, when a graveyard containing several thousand slate coffins was unearthed.

Besides the coffins, the remains of buildings were found as well as implements used on a daily basis by the Neolithic Beinan people who lived here 2,000 or 3,000 years ago. We can catch a glimpse of the high level of civilization attained by these people from their pillared houses, the rich forms of the artifacts they left behind, the exquisite nature of their handicraft, and their burial customs.



## 5/8(Fri)

- Sanxiantai

Formerly, Sanxiantai was a narrow, elongated cape in the ocean. When the neck of the cape was eroded by the tide, the rest of the cape was disconnected from the land and became an island. It is said that three gods, named Li Tieguai, Lu Dongbin and He Xiangu visited here and left three pairs of footprints. The isolated island has remained unaffected by human civilization and preserves abundant seashore plant species, and was thus claimed a natural reserve later on. There is also a famous eight-arch cross-ocean bridge, a great spot to watch the sun rising over the Pacific Ocean.



- Swallow Grotto

This part of Tailuge (Taroko) Gorge is composed of marble cliff faces covered with small holes, the result of long-term erosion by river and ground water. House swifts and Pacific swallows often forage and nest here, giving the place its name.



- Baiyang Trail

Near Wen Mountain (Wenshan), hikers will come upon the tunnel that is the beginning of the Baiyang Trail. Along the trail there are six tunnels of different lengths. The longer tunnels have solar-powered lights. This trail is particularly popular with locals, for it has an atmosphere of mystery and romance. A turn in the trail at the end of the third tunnel offers an excellent view of Tacijili River, and at the end of the sixth tunnel the truly spectacular goal of the trail, Baiyang Waterfall, comes into view. The water roars as it plunges into the deep pool that it has worn in the rock. The Baiyang Suspension Bridge offers spectacular views of the waterfall and the river valley. A seventh tunnel leads to a cave behind the falls; because of the danger of falling rocks, this area is closed to the public. Although this trail is not physically challenging, additional clothing may be necessary to ward off chilly air in the vicinity of the Baiyang Waterfall and it takes approximately 1.5 hours.





5/9(Sat)

- Qixingtian Scenic Area

The beach here is a beautiful curved bay. The sea is clean and blue, and the black stone is crystal clear. It is overlooked by green hills and has road access.



- Yehliu Geopark

The scenic spot extends from the corner of Dagou Mountain to the sea. Due to the effects of wave erosion, weathering and tectonic movements, a variety of unique landscapes have been created, such as sea cave ditch, candle stone, bean curd, honeycomb stone and pot hole. The Queen's Head, Fairy Shoes, Candlestick Stone, etc. are also famous international sea erosion wonders.

## **92nd INTERNATIONAL F.I.C.C. RALLY from 29 July to 07 August 2022 in MOSCOW/RUSSIA**

The rally venue is the municipal park for sport and outdoor leisure activities constructed in 2018. This 25-hectare park is situated on the banks of a river about 15 kms south of the city centre and boasts very modern infrastructure for a wide variety of outdoor activities.

The nearest airport is Sheremetyevo International Airport.

For those travelling by rail, the area is served by five train stations and, for rally-goers arriving by car or caravan, there are four international motorways.

Moscow and the European part of Russia have a well-developed transport system.

The rally registration fee will include the cost of a 30-day visa and Russia is introducing a simplified visa application system in 2020.

The organisers are already working on a varied programme of cultural activities and excursions.

#### **Have a problem-free winter**

Winter is coming and a lot of motorcaravans will be left parked for several months. That is not a problem so long as the vehicle is given proper care and attention beforehand.

A technical maintenance service is advisable before “over-wintering”. Old engine oil, brake lubricants etc can cause corrosion in the engine and braking system. Gas bottles – especially pressure gauges and gas piping - should also be checked by a recognised garage.

Many of the other “things” can be done by the camper owner.

Here is a check list to ensure that your motorcaravan is ready for winter:

- ° Secure shelter (garage, barn etc.)
- ° Good insurance
- ° Full tank with brand fuel
- ° Technical service beforehand
- ° Checks on gas and electricity fittings
- ° Empty the water tank and grey water tank
- ° Open all water taps
- ° Pump up tyres 1 bar above normal pressure
- ° Wash/clean your motorcaravan properly



- ° Stand cushions up vertically
- ° Leave skylight (rooflight) and windows open a crack
- ° Put a moisture remover inside
- ° Remove the gas tank from the motorcaravan
- ° Remove any batteries or leave them on a charger.

## MISCELLANEOUS

### Traffic

#### **Parking regulations in Germany**

Most parking meters indicate the maximum length of stay. This may not be extended even if a new ticket is paid for.

If the machine is out of order, put a parking disk where it can be seen in your vehicle and respect the maximum length of stay as marked.

Even if you are simply sitting in your vehicle, this counts as parking especially if you remain seated in your car for longer than three minutes.

Parking restrictions that are applicable on weekdays also include Saturdays.

#### **Accidents in a hired vehicle: Make sure you do the right thing**

As a general rule, if a driver of another vehicle is involved the police must be called. Failure to do so may compromise one's insurance cover. But a more likely scenario involves minor incidents such as damage to a tyre, a flying stone cracking the windscreen or the odd knock when parking, hitting a bollard or the wall in a narrow underground parking lot. In instances like these you are only obliged to call the police if there is a lot of damage to the vehicle. Experts advise that in the event of any damage at all you should contact the car hire company's insurance firm. You should always take photos of the vehicle at the scene, write a damage report and sign it. Another important point: keep all documents including the hire contract, receipts, credit card slips and indeed any documents relating to payment of your deposit and the deductible (percentage excess). Also copies of any police reports, accident reports or the car hire company's damage report.

And what is an accident in a hire care likely to cost? It all depends on the insurance cover.

If the driver of a hired vehicle has caused the accident, then the hire company nearly always retains the deductible. If on the other hand you decided to include reimbursement of the deductible in your insurance contract then you will recover the deductible according to the terms of your contract with the hire company's insurance. This presupposes however that all of the conditions have been complied with including calling the police. So customers should always ensure that their insurance cover includes reimbursement of the deductible plus protection against glass and tyre damage.

### Health

**Using brain power to move wheelchairs:** Technical advances can bring huge changes to people's lives and doctors at Bochum University (D) are currently testing how a person can use brain power to move a wheelchair. This could come about thanks to a special link-up between the brain, a computer and the wheelchair's steering mechanism. But it will be some time yet before this process will actually work and become generally available.



### **Culture and some other curious facts**

**Where is the world's oldest snack bar?** It appears to be in Regensburg (D) according to recent research. Apparently a "Sausage Kitchen" already existed when the cathedral was being constructed around 500 years ago where labourers working on the cathedral could satisfy their hunger. This little stand is still in place and you can buy sausages to eat on the spot.

**Where is the world's largest museum?** It is in the "The Hermitage" in St. Petersburg, Russia, where there are over 60,000 exhibits on display. This makes it the largest museum of art in the world and it employs 2,500 members of staff.

The **deepest road** is Israel's Highway 90 on the Dead Sea. If you want to stand on dry land at the deepest point on earth you have to descend 420m below sea level. So you take Israel's Highway 90 to reach the west bank of the Dead Sea which is the deepest point on earth that is not under water.

### **Environment**

The "**sunflower starfish**" has 50 arms and its diameter measures between 70 and 100 cms. It is mainly found in the Pacific Ocean, on the west coast of the USA.
